

DUAL ENROLLMENT MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Dual Enrollment Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") entered into by and between:

Global Outreach Charter Academy High School ("the school", "School", or "you")

and Doral College (the "College" or "College").

WHEREAS, the College is a Florida postsecondary institution of higher learning offering dual enrollment courses as contemplated by Section 1007.271, Florida Statutes.

WHEREAS, School is a Florida public charter school as defined in Section 1002.33, Florida Statutes;

WHEREAS, both the College and the School desire to enter into a memorandum of understanding to have eligible students of School participate in the College's dual enrollment program (the "Program" or "Program"), which will take place during the term of the MOU (as defined in Section VII.a. herein);

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

I. General Description.

- a. During the term of this MOU, as outlined in Section VII.a. herein, the College shall allow Eligible Students (as defined in Section V herein) of School to participate in the Program in accordance with the terms of this MOU. The list of the College's courses that are eligible for dual enrollment can be found in the Doral College Catalog.
- b. The MOU is a modification of all existing dual enrollment articulation MOUs that may exist between the Parties.
- c. The College offers dual enrollment courses in the fall and spring semesters as well as during the summer term of the College's academic calendar. Program courses may be offered in a face-to-face, online, or hybrid format.
- d. Students who complete a Program course shall receive the appropriate number of Doral College credits for that course as listed in the Doral College catalog, subject to the minimum grade requirements outlined in state law and/or in the College's policies. Students who participate in the Program and complete all degree requirements will be eligible to receive an Associate in Arts degree from the College.
- e. Program courses shall be of the same level of rigor as courses taught to traditional College students.
- f. Doral College shall not be obligated to arrange or assume any financial responsibility for transportation which may be required for the School's students to attend Program courses or co-curricular activities. Any responsibility for transportation will either be that of the student or School.

- II. School Duties and Responsibilities. The School will:
- a. Inform its student body and their parents about opportunities for participation in the Program and, in doing so, may post information about the Program's course offerings on its website(s), address the Program in correspondence to its students, or use other similar means to encourage Eligible Students' involvement in the Program. At School's request, College will provide School with promotional materials, allowing the School to share information about the College with its students. The School may also solicit the assistance of the College to assist in promotional efforts and the College will provide such assistance as it deems reasonable.
 - b. Purchase Program course materials for students when required for the Program course. Doral College reserves the right to determine the textbooks, instructional materials, laboratory materials, and technology resources used in its courses. The School bears the responsibility of providing these materials for its students if not already provided by the College. Doral College will inform the School as to the specific materials that will be required for each course as soon as the information becomes available but no later than one month before the course is offered.
 - c. Furnish payment to the college for the cost of the Eligible Students; participation in dual enrollment courses, including tuition and fee amounts, under such terms as outlined in this MOU.
 - d. Comply with relevant provisions of the Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), including such provisions relating to confidentiality of student records.
- III. Doral College's Duties and Responsibilities. Doral College will:
- a. Provide an Eligible Student the opportunity to take Program courses and, upon completion of a Program course, provide the Eligible Student with the appropriate number of Doral College credits for that course as listed in the Doral College catalog, subject to the minimum grade requirements outlined in state law. Program courses may be offered at the College campus, online, or at the School campus. Any College instructor who teaches a College class at the School campus may be subject to Level 2 Background screening requirements as outlined in state law.
 - b. Provide the School with grade reports or transcripts (as requested) for each Eligible Student's participation in the Program following the end of each semester term.
 - c. Provide sufficient college-credentialed instructors to teach Program courses. The recruitment and supervision of the instructional faculty shall be the responsibility of the College. The College, with the permission of School, may credential School instructors to teach Program courses at the School campus.
 - d. Comply with relevant provisions of the Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), including such provisions relating to confidentiality of student records.
 - e. Provide services and resources for Eligible Students with disabilities who register for the Program to allow them to effectively participate in the Program.
- IV. Doral College Supplemental Educational Service Offerings. In addition to the furnishing of Program courses, Eligible Students of School enrolled in the Program shall also receive additional services (as outlined in this Section IV) designed to augment their high

school educational experience, expose them to the resources and opportunities that are unique to an institution of higher learning, and prepare them for future college attendance upon graduation from the School. These supplemental services include:

- a. Library Access. Program students shall have full access, at no charge to the student, to Doral College's on-campus library facilities and resources during regular library hours, as well as to all online library services (including electronic collection holdings) offered by the College.
- b. Academic Advising. Program students shall be permitted to utilize and interact with Doral College's academic advising staff, resources, and materials.
- c. Academic Tutoring Services. The College offers 24/7 tutoring services through Pearson's Smarthinking platform.
- d. College Advising Assistance. The Office of Student Services and Activities shall provide college advising services to assist students in attending a four-year college or university upon graduation from the Program. Services offered include assistance with school selection, applications, and financial aid.
- e. Co-Curricular Student Activities. Students in the Program shall be eligible to participate in any co-curricular activities offered by the College and its student organizations, subject to the individual eligibility policies of each student organization.

- V. Eligible Students. In order for a student of School to be an "Eligible Student" to participate in the Program, the student must meet the following requirements:
- a. Be enrolled in School in the 6th-12th grade
 - b. Be admitted to Doral College, in accordance with the College's admissions requirements and procedures.
 - c. Hold a cumulative unweighted high school grade point average of at least 3.0 upon admission (unless otherwise permitted by College policies) and maintain that average throughout Program enrollment.
 - d. Earn a sufficient score on a state-approved placement test (in accordance with College policies and state law), unless otherwise permitted by College policies.
 - e. Submit completed College application materials with signatures from the student's parent
 - f. Express an intent to pursue a postsecondary degree
 - g. Comply with all College policies and procedures, including those outlined in the Doral College Student Handbook, as amended. All students shall be expected to adhere to all College policies, including those outlined in the College's Student Handbook, as amended. The College reserves the right to remove any Eligible Student from the Program (or otherwise discipline an Eligible Student in the Program) in accordance with the College's policies and procedures. Doral College reserves the right to remove any student from a Program course if the student is disruptive to the learning process such that the progress of other students or the efficient administration of the course is hindered. Students who will graduate from School prior to the completion of the College's postsecondary course may not register for the course through dual enrollment.


VI. Funding for Program Courses. For each Eligible Student that enrolls in a Program course and does not withdraw prior to the add/drop date, the School shall pay the College \$57 per credit hour plus a \$10 per enrollment book fee. The College shall invoice the School for payments due following the add/drop period each semester, with payment due within thirty (30) days of invoicing. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the School under this Agreement has an existing Educational Services Agreement with the College that outlines an alternative fee arrangement for courses provided, then the pricing terms of that alternative fee arrangement shall govern (provided that such arrangement does not run afoul of applicable law).

VII. Additional Terms and Conditions

- a. This MOU is effective as of August 1, 2020 (the "Effective Date") and shall continue in effect for one (1) year.
- b. In the event of any conflicts between any policies outlined in this MOU (including student eligibility policies) and any relevant requirements of state law, the state law requirements shall govern.
- c. All questions with respect to the construction of this MOU or the rights and liabilities of the parties hereunder shall be determined in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida. Any legal action taken or to be taken by either party regarding this MOU or the rights and liabilities of parties hereunder shall be brought only before a federal, state, or local court of competent jurisdiction located within the State of Florida. Each party hereby consents to the jurisdiction of the federal, state, and local courts within the State of Florida.
- d. This MOU shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of each party, its subsidiaries, affiliates, related entities, partners, agents, officers, directors, employees, heirs, successors, and assigns, without regard to whether it is expressly acknowledged in any instrument of succession or assignment.

IN WITNESS THEREOF, the President of Doral College and the Principal of the School are the signatories to this MOU.


